1 De-us. \* De-us me-us, réspi-ce in me: qua-re me de-re-li-quí-sti?

2 ∇. Lon-ge a sa-lú-te me-a ver-ba de-lic-tó-rum me-ó-rum.

3 ∇. De-us me-us clamá-bo per bo-per di-em, nec exáu-di-es: in nocte, et non ad insi-pi-én-ti-am mi-hi.

4 ∇. Tu au-tem in sancto há-bi-tas, laus Is-ra-el.

5 ∇. In te spe-ravé-runt patres nos-tri: spe-ra-vé-runt, et li-be-rásti e-os.

6 ∇. Ad te cla-mavé-runt, et sal-vi-fac-ti sunt: in te spe-ra-vé-runt, et non sunt con-fú-si.

7 ∇. Ego au-tem sum vermis, et non ho-mo: op-pró-bri-um hó-minum, et ab-jécti-o ple-bis.

8 ∇. Omnes qui vi-dé-bant me, asperna-bán-tur me: locú-ti sunt lá-bi-is et mové-runt ca-put.

9 ∇. Spe-rá-vit in Dó-mi-no, e-rí-pi-at e-um: sal-vum fá-ci-at e-um, quóni-am vult e-um.

10 ∇. Ipsi ve-ro consi-de-ravé-runt, et conspexé-runt me: di-vi-sé-runt si-bi vestimé-nta me-a, et super vestem me-am mi-sé-runt sortem.

11 ∇. Li-be-ra me de ore le-ó-nis: et a có-r-ni-bus uni-cornu-ó-rum humi-li-tá-tem me-am.

12 ∇. Qui tímé-tis Dó-mi-num, laudá-te e-um: uni-vérsum semen Ja-cob, magni-fi-cá-te e-um.

13 ∇. Annunti-á-bi-tur Dó-mi-no ge-ne-rá-ti-o ventú-ra: et annunti-ábunt cae-li justí-ti-am e-jus.

14 ∇. Pó-pu-lo qui nascé-tur, quem fe-cit \* Dó-mi-nus.
